DIGGING DEEPER: 1. Read each of these verses and discuss what they have in common with each other:

- **Proverbs 12:18** There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.
- **2 Corinthians 13:10** For this reason I write these things while I am away from you, that when I come I may not have to <u>be severe</u> in my use of the authority that the Lord has given me <u>for building up</u> and not <u>for tearing down</u>.
- **2 Timothy 2:25** <u>correcting</u> his opponents <u>with gentleness</u>. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth,
- **2 Timothy 4:2** <u>preach the word</u>; be ready in season and out of season; <u>reprove, rebuke, and exhort</u>, <u>with complete</u> patience and teaching.
- **Galatians 6:1** Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should <u>restore him</u> in <u>a spirit</u> of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted.
